What is Legal Aid Line?

Legal Aid Line offers free intake and referral services for eligible low-income Ohioans living in 32 counties in northwest Ohio and agricultural workers living anywhere in Ohio.

When you call Legal Aid Line, you will be asked to input your phone number, including area code, for a callback that same day.

When you apply online at www.legalaidline.org, you will receive a call from an Intake Specialist in 1–2 business days.

When you receive your callback, you will speak with an Intake Specialist who will gather basic information such as your name, address, birth date, phone number, and the name of the person or business you are having a problem with. The Intake Specialist will also ask you a few questions about the problem you are experiencing.

Please be sure to get your papers and facts together before you apply. Our staff can better assist you if the information you will need is close at hand.
